Since our last newsletter in summer 2018, ReflectLab has made a lot of progress. At the project meeting in Iași, Romania, we discussed our experience with the implementation of ReflectLabs and how to further improve the method, as well as details of the learning platform and dissemination activities.



Spreading the ReflectLab experience

At **Manchester Metropolitan University**, a meeting of teachers was held on 10th February, during which they were presented the ReflectLab project and methodology. As a result of this meeting, further training sessions to Heads of Department and senior staff are to take place in April in two local secondary schools, with a view to implement ReflectLabs within the curriculum across a range of academic subjects.



On February 21st, the “Day of teaching” organised by the **Leibniz University Hannover** attracted more than 140 lecturers from different departments. ReflectLab was presented at a poster session.



What is ReflectLab?

“ReflectLab – Supporting lecturers in applying inquiry based learning” is an Erasmus+ project funded by the European Commission and runs from November 2016 to April 2019. The consortium consists of universities from Torun (Poland), La Laguna (Spain), Manchester (UK), Iași (Romania) and Hanover (Germany) and is coordinated by Prof. Dr. Dirk Lange at the Leibniz University Hanover. The project enables teachers to support students to engage in ongoing discussions about controversial issues, e.g. migration or racism, through inquiry based and problem oriented learning. It provides a framework for accompanying students in their autonomous research and equip them with the necessary input and skills. In addition to thematic webinars, the consortium develops manuals for teachers and students on the ReflectLab methodology as well as an easy-to-implement-kit. All materials are made available on an IT-platform.

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
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
